



Winter Valley's new \$2m playground opens for fun

BALLARAT families have a new fun playground to check out with the official opening yesterday of an eye-catch-ing hilltop playground in Winter Valley.

The \$2 million Winter field Park on Moritz Drive pays homage to the city's goldrush history with a poppet head tower, visible from throughout the Winterfield estate, looming over the playground which also features hill access s. multiple slides, an
